I am told that in days of old, in bold faith we launched a school, but that a partnership with LCEF - Lutheran Church Extension Fund was needed to help secure the \$600,000 financing of the school in 2002. A 30-year loan was acquired, and we steadily made payments toward the balance. There were plentiful years and tough years. There were times when we refinanced and other periods when we had trouble making payimportantly, God's work and ments. Most will was done. The people of Our Hope Lu-Church and School theran stepped up. Some made direct mortgage payments from personal accounts, others took bills off the bulletin board, most importantly the people of Our Hope worked in unity and love toward the mission of spreading the Gospel to the community of Huntertown. By the grace of God, the mortgage had been fully paid as of June 30th. This is a time to celebrate, a time to make a joyful noise, a time to burn the mortgage.

By the grace of God we are the Hope of Huntertown...One family at a time.



A Best-Seller for Your Summer Reading List"

June 18, 2021

2 Timothy 2:15 - "Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the Word of truth."

A few years ago, three-dimensional puzzles flooded the marketplace. Intended for mechanically minded adults, the puzzles came with instructions that sometimes were as baffling as the puzzles themselves. The problem developed when customers were hard pressed to glean the instruction writer's exact meaning. The puzzles were made in the Far East, and the instructions were printed in technically flawless English. Nevertheless, the logic of these instructions revealed a definite cultural communication gap between the author in Tokyo and his reader in Peoria.

It seems the same sort of thing can happen when we read the Scriptures. Repeatedly, Christians are urged to read the Bible each day. God has made available to us so much power and beauty in His Word. Yet rarely do we hear anyone stop to give us clear, step -by-step directions on how to get the most out of personal Bible study.

Perhaps you already have found a good method. If not, I'd like to share a process that's been helpful to me. It's so exciting to hear Christ speak to my life from His Word. My prayer is that God's Holy Spirit will lead you also into a deeper fellowship with Him through that Word, and that by this you might know and love God the Father and Jesus Christ who He has sent (see John 17:3).

- Step 1. In prayer, trust in Jesus' promise that the Holy Spirit "will guide you into all truth" (John 16:13b). Ask Him to settle your mind and prepare your heart as He shows you what He intends you to put to use in your life.
- Step 2. Read through the Bible passages you are studying carefully. If you have any Bible study aids (lexicon, concordance, bi-lingual resources like a Hebrew-English or a Greek-English Bible), use them to intensify your study. Continue praying for God's guidance as you read.
- Step 3. When God's Word shows you a promise or a word of encouragement or convinces you of something you need to address in your life—stop. Make a note of it in the margin and add this item to your prayer list.
- Step 4. Pray about what you have read and thank the Lord Jesus. Ask for His help. Confess your sin. Receive His grace and forgiveness. Respond in whatever way that is called for by the text.

There is so much to be gained from diving into God's Word and swimming deeply in its refreshing waters. When I am consistent and do this regularly, I am always blessed—and often in wonderful and unexpected ways. I learn of a God who has created me, redeemed me through the blood of Jesus Christ, and who is calling me each day unto an eternity with Him.

In response to this blessing, I speak to God from my heart, and He speaks to me from His. He has given us all things, and He invites us to learn more about Him in His glorious Word.

THE PRAYER: Heavenly Father, teach us to be good students of Your Word. In Jesus' Name. Amen.



Church Council Meeting—June 1, 2021

President Richard Thonert opened the meeting. 10 members, 5 guests, and Pastor in attendance. See attached sign-in sheet.

Pastor Terkula shared some scripture verses for encouragement and support inspired by The Lutheran Foundation. See attached.

Becky Clem made a motion to approve the minutes from the May meeting, Dan Braun seconded, motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Terkula suggests using the Mental Health Efforts survey attached to the scripture verses used for the devotion. See attached survey.

Elders Report: Jack Springer reported that the next Elders meeting is Saturday, June 5. The Elders have decided that the mask mandate is now optional.

Christian Outreach: Chairman, Dr. Schamehorn not present, no report.

Stewardship: Chairman Becky Clem had nothing to report.

Christian Education: Chairman, Gina Pippenger had nothing to report.

Youth & Family: Chairman, Ashley Armentrout, not presenst, no report.

School Board: Chairman Melissa Satterthwaite is temporarily not able to fulfill her duties as school board chairman. The school board met and voted to have Tammy Trauner take over as acting president, until Melissa is able to resume her duties.

Property: Chairman Jim Fortman reported that there is a drain problem is the church kitchen.

Financial Secretary: Chairman Bev Oehler had nothing to report.

Treasurer: Michelle Braun reported: The fencing around the playground is done, cost was \$5,450.00 which the school raised; the bus cost was \$27,575.00, using \$15,000.00 from savings until the money from the Inherited IRA can be transferred to Our Hope PNC account; David Wendt payments to seminary have been sent; Congregation's Vicar account is \$600.00 short; there is \$8,528.11 in the Environmental Fund and the Back Flow Preventer repair was \$2,630.00. Michelle made motion that this expense be paid from the Environmental Fund, motion seconded and carried; Mortgage payoff is around \$112,000.00

Endowment Fund: Committee met and received several Applications for Funds from the Inherited IRA the Endowment Fund received from Dave Edyvean. The committee is recommending the following applications be presented to Voter's on Sunday, June 6. Covering soffits on the Church with aluminum: \$8,525.00, Cover external wood at the entrance to the church with matching vinyl: \$2,846.00; Replace exterior doors with 42" doors and one will have an automatic handicap opener: \$7,176.00; Replace interior doors and one door will have an automatic handicap opener: \$10,568.00; Toys/Furniture from Creative Treasures: \$3,500.00; 11 new laptops (9 for school, 1- music, 1-accountant): \$8,500.00; Hearing App for the sanctuary and 2 tablets: \$1,100.00. Total for all requests is \$42,215.00.

Old Business:

Finance Committee- Tammy Trauner reported: the Finance Committee was formed to review the treasurer's books; the committee is creating procedures and policies for when the accountant starts. Going over the LCMS Treasurer's Manual for guidance. Jack Springer said an audit was brought up a few months ago and it was not meant to "ruffle feathers". Sharon Byerley suggested that when our insurance policies come up for renewal, we get 3 quotes to be sure our rates are competitive. We will talk at the finance committee to create a policy. Accountant-\$900.00 a month. Stipend for Pastor Bob for overseeing Vicar-\$300.00-\$400.00 /month. Becky Clem made a motion for \$350.00 for Pastor Bob will be paid out of the Vicar Fund if available (since we may not have to pay for the Vicar's insurance), if the funds are not available we will wait until the budget meetings to designate where the funds w ill come from. Gina Pippenger seconded. Motions carried.

Edyvean Inherited IRA General Fund Gift- Have already used \$36,000.00 for Vicar and \$15,000.00 for the bus. Becky Clem made a motion to invest \$500,000.00 with Fidelity. Dan Braun seconded. It was decided to let Fidelity invest the funds, with the goal of earning 5%, or more, interest over 3-5 years. Vote taken: 4- Yes, 3- No, motion carried. Cindy Fortman and Michelle Braun will contact Fidelity to get the funds invested. Tammy presented the Application for Funds from the General Fund Gift to be presented to Voter's on June 6: Enclosing pavilion for parking and storage: \$32,000.00; Bells for Children's Choir: \$1,100,00; Washing station and electrical for school: \$2,000.00; Mortgage payoff: \$112,400.00. Jim Fortman made a motion to consider these applications separately, Michelle Braun, seconded. Motion carried. Tammy Trauner made a motion to purchase bells, \$1,100.00, for the Children's Choir, Jack Springer seconded. Motion carried. Tammy Trauner made a motion to purchase washing stations and electricity, \$2,000.00, Michelle Braun seconded. Motion carried. Tammy Trauner made a motion to enclose the pavilion, \$32,000.00, Dan Braun seconded. Motion carried. Tammy Trauner made a motion to pay-off the mortgage, \$112,400.00, Dan Braun seconded. Discussion followed: Current Mortgage payment is \$3,586.00 per month. Could use that mortgage payment for Pastor Bob stipend, Accountant salary, and put the balance of the mortgage payment in the capital improvement fund. Motion carried. Becky Clem reminded council that at the April 13, 21 council meeting a motion passed to take to Voter's using a first-fruit, 10%, portion of the Inherited IRA General Fund gift given by Dave Edyvean, in the amount of \$90,000.00, to support various charities.

Special Voter's Meeting — June 6, 2021

President Richard Thonert welcomed everyone to the meeting. There were 30 members in attendance. Pastor Terkula opened with The Lord's Prayer. No new voting members were present.

Tammy Trauner presented the following proposals from the General Fund Gift given by Dave Edyvean that were approved at the last council meeting.

1. Close in the pavilion in order to park our vehicles and use for additional storage,

approximately \$32,000.

2. Purchase bells for Children's Choir, \$1,100.

 Purchase two handwashing stations for the classrooms in the FAC, \$2,000.
 Pay-off mortgage, \$112,500. (Suggestion made to use current mortgage payment to put in capital projects fund, use to pay accountant, use to pay Pastor Bob as needed for mentoring the Vicar. We will save approximately

\$10,000 over the course of the loan if we pay off the mortgage.)
General Fund Gift proposals total: \$147,500.00.

Melissa Satterthwaite made a motion to approve these General Fund Gift proposals, Adrienne Cowgill seconded, motion carried. Total General Fund Gift proposals approved is now: \$198,500.00. (Includes \$36,000 for Vicar, \$15,000 for bus.)

Rod Bourassa, Richard Thonert, and Cindy Fortman presented the Endowment Fund Gift proposals from the Dave Edyvean Endowment Gift that were approved at the last Endowment Fund meeting.

1. Covering soffits in the church with aluminum, \$8,525.

2. Cover external wood at the entrance to the church with matching vinyl, \$2,846.

3. Replace exterior doors with 42" doors and one would have an automatic handicap openėr, \$7,176.

4. Replace interior doors and one door will have an automatic handicap opener, \$10,568.

5. Toys/Furniture from Creative Treasures, \$3,500.

6. 11 new laptops (9 for school, 1 for music, 1 for accountant), \$8,500.

7. Hearing App for the sanctuary and 2 tablets, \$1,100.

Endowment Fund Gift proposals total: \$42,215.00. (When the front entrance of the church has been completed, it was suggested to put a memorial plague in honor of the generous gift Dave Edyvean has given to OHLC&S.) Bey Oehler made a motion to approve these Endowment Fund Gift proposals, Tammy Trauner seconded. Motion carried.

Discussion followed on setting aside \$90,000 (10% First Fruits) from the General Fund Gift given by Dave Edyvean to be placed on a line item in the budget to be used for outside charities. Dan Braun made a motion to approve, Becky Clem seconded. Ballot vote taken: 25- yes, 3- no, motion carried. (Total General Fund Gift proposals approved is now: \$288,500.00.)

Next Special Voter's meeting is scheduled on Thursday, July 8, 2021, in order to approve any proposals that may be brought to the next Endowment Fund meeting and the next church council meeting.

Ryan Bell announced that John Harris can no longer continue the weekly cleaning of the church vehicles. Ryan Bell will clean them over the summer, but volunteers will be needed after the summer.

Jim Fortman has posted a mowing sign up sheet on the bulletin board. Please consider helping out.

Becky Clem reminded the voter's that we approved investing \$500,000 with Fidelity. Cindy Fortman and Michelle Braun will contact the Fidelity rep.

Carol Thonert stated that Fidelity is offering a credit card to their wealth management clients. Less than \$250,000 pay back rate is 2%, more than \$250,000 rate is 3%. Martha Moehle made a motion to apply for a Fidelity credit card, Carol Thonert seconded. Motion carried.

Thank you to John Harris for taking the time and keeping the vans clean. Meeting closed with the Doxology.
